AFFECTED CODE SECTIONS:

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill provides that the Department of Public Works and Transportation shall have up to six months to initiate the process of conducting the study and making a determination of whether to install speed humps. The installation of speed humps may only be used at a location approved by the Prince George's County Council, by resolution. Further, the bill provides that the Director of the Department of Public Works and Transportation shall respond, in writing, within six months of a request from a County Council member, as to a final decision regarding whether the Department will install speed monitoring systems on a particular location of roadway and include an estimated time for installation.
