**BILL**

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Video Lottery Facility Funding Requirements

3 For the purpose of requiring that twenty-five percent (25%) of County revenue derived from  
4 table game proceeds from video lottery facilities be allocated to public safety, subject to certain  
5 conditions.

6 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

7 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

8 Section 10-309.01,

9 The Prince George's County Code

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,  
12 Maryland, that Section 10-309.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby  
13 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

14 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

15 DIVISION 22. VIDEO LOTTERY FACILITY LOCAL BUSINESS, HIRING, AND  
16 FUNDING REQUIREMENTS.

17 **Sec. 10-309.01. Video Lottery Facility Funding.**

18 (a) Fifty percent (50%) of Annual Local Gaming Revenue, up to a maximum of \$25  
19 million, shall be allocated for public education purposes by the County in its regular or  
20 supplemental budget processes.

21 (1) "**Public education purposes**" in this Section means operating or capital budget

1 spending for the Prince George's County Public Schools (including pre-kindergarten through  
2 12<sup>th</sup> grade), Prince George's Community College, and Prince George's County Memorial Library  
3 System.

4 (2) "**Annual Local Gaming Revenue**" in this Section means the total revenue that the  
5 County derives (or is projected to derive) each fiscal year from the following:

6 (A) Local impact grants distributed to the County from video lottery terminal  
7 proceeds, excluding funds reserved for Maryland Highway 210, provided that such local impact  
8 grants are expended in the communities in immediate proximity to the video lottery facility in  
9 accordance with the procedures and requirements of state law;

10 (B) Revenue distributed to the County from table games proceeds in accordance  
11 with state law;

12 (C) Real property and personal property taxes;

13 (D) Hotel and motel taxes; and

14 (E) Admissions and amusement taxes.

15 (b) The County may exceed the maximum allocation for public education purposes set  
16 forth in subsection (a), above, by local ordinance.

17 (c) Twenty-five percent (25%) of the revenue distributed to the County from table games  
18 proceeds in accordance with state law shall be allocated for public safety purposes in the local  
19 impact area within five (5) miles of the video lottery facility by the County in its regular or  
20 supplemental budget processes.

21 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that revenue reserved for public safety  
22 purposes in accordance with Section 10-309.01(c) of this Act shall be used to supplement, not  
23 supplant, other county general fund revenue already allocated for public safety purposes.

24 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)  
25 calendar days after it becomes law.
