**BILL**

1 AN ACT concerning

2 The Classification Plan for Prince George's County

3 For the purpose of amending the Classification Plan which, pursuant to CB-44-2006, eliminated  
4 and added certain classes of work in accordance with the Public Employee Relations Board  
5 (PERB) Representation Amendment of Certification, and established a new Y Salary Schedule.  
6 This act amends the Classification Plan by correcting the class code for two classes of  
7 employees.

8 WHEREAS, the County Executive, pursuant to Section 903 of the Prince George's County  
9 Charter and Section 16-125(a) of the Prince George's County Code has, in order to provide better  
10 governmental services, recommended to the County Council amendments to the Classification  
11 Plan for Prince George's County with respect to certain classes of work described within Section  
12 1 of this Bill; now, therefore,

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,  
14 Maryland, that the Classification Plan for Prince George's County be and the same is hereby  
15 amended as follows:

16 332[6]8Y Paramedic Battalion Chief, Y-06

17 3365[R]Y Firefighter/Medic Battalion Chief, Y-06

18 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)  
19 calendar days after it becomes law and shall be retroactively effective to July 9, 2006.
