Committee Vote: Favorable, 3-0 (In favor: Council Members Castaldi,
Casula and Wineland)This resolution amends the Salary Schedule W (Compensation and Benefits)
for Deputy Sheriffs (Privates - Lieutenants) and reflect the terms of
the labor agreement and wage scale adjustments.CR-29-1990 contains a modified pay plan (Uniform Wage Scale) which
includes a four percent (4%) increase in the base hourly rates
retroactively effective July 2, 1989, a 2.03% wage scale adjustment on
July 1, 1990 and July 14, 1991 respectively.The fiscal impact of CR-29-1990 must include CB-37-1990. The estimated
negative fiscal impact on the County is approximately \$2,509,472 as

This Salary Schedule W for the deputy sheriff unit personnel reflects the terms of the labor agreement and also recognizes a 2.03% wage scale adjustment on July 1, 1990 and July 14, 1991 respectively, made by implementing recommendations of the Public Safety Classification Study.
