REPORT Committee Vote: Favorable 3-2 (In Favor: Council Members Toles, Davis, and Turner; Opposed: Council Members Harrison and Lehman)

This resolution will approve a multi-year contract with CMT Service, Inc. for training, management and administration of the Business Development Reserve Program (BDRP). The two year agreement provides compensation in the amount of \$1,217,200.75 with options for extension.

In accordance with Section 819 of the County Charter, the Council must approve all multi-year contracts exceeding an aggregate of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000).

The BDRP is a two year (2) pilot program designed for local small businesses to gain knowledge and skills to effectively compete for contracting opportunities with County, State, and Federal agencies. The County's objective is to help stimulate and expand the local tax base and increase the number of viable opportunities for County residents.

The Office of Law has reviewed this resolution and finds it to be in proper legislative form with not legal impediments to its adoption.

During the worksession Committee members expressed concerns about the bidding process and adhering to regulations which are in place for protection and fairness.

The resolution was held in Committee on 05/07/2014 for further discussion.

There will be a negative fiscal impact on the County in the amount of \$1,217,220.75 over the two-year period with the adoption of CR-17-2014.
