This bill will adopt the 1995 Inventory of Real Property and Improvements. This legislation is submitted in accordance with Section 2-111.01 of the County Code. This section requires the County Executive to establish an inventory of all real property and improvements titled in the name of Prince George's County and to submit the inventory to the Council no later than the first day of May of each year for adoption.
