- PUBLIC HEARING HELD; CONFIRMED

Council Member Exum, Chair of the Public Safety and Fiscal Management (PSFM)

Hylton to serve as Chief of Police for Prince George's County. County Executive, Jack B. Johnson, introduced Mr. Hylton to the Council. Mr. Hylton was present and spoke on his own behalf. Mr. Gabriel Christian, Esq., Former Police Chief David Mitchell and Gustavo A. Torres, Executive Director, CASA de Maryland, Inc. spoke in support of the nomination. All persons wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Campos moved confirmation of Robert L. CR-9-2009 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING VICTORY CREST SENIOR

<u>APARTMENTS</u> for the purpose of approving a \$1.3 million HOME Loan for the Victory Crest Senior Apartments project and amending the Prince George's County "Annual Action Plan: FY 2006" and "Annual Action Plan: FY 2009" to include project and project funding.

Council Resolution 9 approves a \$1.3 million HOME Loan for Victory Crest Senior Apartments, amending the FY 2006 and FY 2009 Annual Action Plans to include the project, its costs and funding sources and reprogramming FY 2006 HOME funds to finance a portion of the project costs.
