This Emergency Bill will provide a supplementary appropriation of \$3.0 million to the County's General Fund operating budget for Fiscal Year 2003. The source of funding is from real property tax revenues generated in excess of the amount estimated to be received in this fiscal year.

Also, this legislation will increase funding in the Grants and Transfer component of the County's Non-Departmental budget by \$3.0 million. The increase in the Grants and Transfer budget will enable the County to provide a one-time grant of \$3.0 million to Dimensions Health Corporation for financial support in the continuation of essential health services benefiting the citizens of Prince George's County.

Mr. Winfield M. Kelly, Jr., President and CEO of Dimensions Healthcare System and Dr. George Bone, a private physician and member of the Board of Directors of Dimensions, addressed the committee in support of this legislation.

Mr. Kelly stated that as a result of indigent care burden and declining market position, Dimensions has lost approximately \$50 million over the past five years. Consequently, they have depleted their cash reserves to cover the deficits. At this point, Dimensions has no cash available for capital needs and cannot access the debt markets due to their financial condition. It is impossible to operate a healthcare organization such as Dimensions for very long without access to capital.

Dr. Bone said that although the \$3.0 million grant from the County will not completely solve the problem it is an important step in the right direction. On behalf of the medical staff and the patients of Dimensions he strongly urges the approval of this grant.

There will be a negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of enacting CB-22-2003.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT
