**BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT**

**(Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)**

The Proposed WSSC FY's 2000-2005 Capital Improvements Program contains 120 projects totaling \$879 million. \$303 million, equals 34% of the \$879 million, which is proposed to fund growth. As authorized by the Maryland General Assembly, both Prince George's and Montgomery Councils concurs with the Commission's proposal to increase SDC by 1.8% to reflect the increase in the CPI from \$200 to \$203. Action taken by Prince George's County will reduce the total CIP by \$550,000. Bi-County action will reduce the total CIP by \$4,838,000 to reflect changes in FY 00 estimates for the Six Year Water and Sewer CIP.
