BILL

AN ACT concerning

Administrative Hearings

For the purpose of clarifying ambiguity with respect to requirements for seeking judicial review and aligning the appellate rights for administrative citations with those that are available for civil citations.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

SUBTITLE 13. HOUSING AND PROPERTY STANDARDS.

Section 13-1129

The Prince George's County Code (2023 Edition; 2024 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 13-1129 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 13. HOUSING AND PROPERTY STANDARDS.

DIVISION 15. ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS.

SUBDIVISION 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Sec. 13-1129. - Judicial [and appellate] review.

[(a) Judicial review.

(1)] Any party who[, after having exhausted all administrative remedies available] is aggrieved by a final decision of the Administrative Hearing Unit may seek judicial review of that decision by petition to the Circuit Court for Prince George's County in accordance with the

1 Maryland Rules.[(2)] The filing of an appeal does not stay an order of the Administrative
2 Hearing Unit, unless the Circuit Court for Prince George's County grants a stay.

3 [(b) **Appellate review.** A party to the judicial review may appeal the court's final judgment
4 to the Court of Special Appeals in accordance with the Maryland Rules.]

5 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
6 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
7 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
8 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
9 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
10 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
11 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
12 or section.

13 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
14 calendar days after it becomes law.


