1. CONSENT AGENDA -- ADOPTED AND ALL ACTIONS APPROVED

(a) Approval of County Council Minutes - APPROVED

Council Member Dernoga noted an error on the County Council Minutes for November 19, 2002. Chairman Shapiro noted the suggested correction. County Council Minutes were approved for Council Sessions held on November 19, 2002, December 3, 2002, January 14, 2003 and January 21, 2003.

(b) <u>First Reading of Bills (Presentation)</u>

<u>CB-9-2003 - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING REDUCING/EXERCISE SALON OR</u>
<u>HEALTH CLUB</u> for the purpose of permitting reducing/exercise salons or health clubs in the E-I-A Zone. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 9 was presented by Council Member Knotts and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.

(c) Introduction of Resolutions

<u>CR-4-2003 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING MILITARY LEAVE</u> for the purpose of amending the Salary Plan of the County to reflect the addition of certain Military Leave Benefits. - <u>INTRODUCED</u>

Council Resolution 4 was proposed by the Chairman at the request of the County Executive and referred to the Public Safety, Fiscal Management Committee. Council Resolution 4 amends the Salary Plans of the County to continue certain military leave benefits and extends eligibility for the benefits to any County employee called to active military duty in the event of military action against Iraq or North Korea. Council Resolution 4 was introduced by Chairman Shapiro and Council Members Dean, Exum, Knotts, Dernoga, Harrington and Peters.

CR-5-2003 - A RESOLUTION CONCERNING APPROVAL OF A CERTAIN REFUNDING PLAN OF THE WASHINGTON SUBURBAN SANITARY COMMISSION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING BONDS for the purpose of approving the Refunding Plan of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission for the refunding of certain bonds of Washington Suburban Sanitary District through the issuance of General Construction Refunding Bonds, Water Supply Refunding Bonds and Sewage Disposal Refunding Bonds of Washington Suburban Sanitary District. - INTRODUCED

Council Resolution 5 was proposed by the Chairman at the request of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and referred to the Transportation, Housing and the Environment Committee. Council Resolution 5, which approves the Refunding Plan of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, was introduced by Council Members Shapiro and Dean.
