Council Resolution 43, as proposed by Council Chair Harrison, modifies the System Development Charge (SDC) to help finance the capital costs of expanding and augmenting water and sewage systems to accommodate service to subscribers in the Washington Suburban Sanitary District (WSSD) and to provide a financing mechanism to aid the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (Commission) in paying for the capital projects thereof by providing methods and procedures by which the SDC is to be implemented and/or collected was introduced by Council Member Davis. Council Member Davis moved to suspend the Council Rules of Procedure to allow for immediate adoption of Council Resolution 43; seconded by Council Member Patterson. The motion carried by voice vote. Council Member Olson moved adoption of Council Resolution 43; seconded by Council Member Davis. The motion carried 9-0.
