	Maryland Memorial to the Victims of Terrorism
For the purpose of	of expressing the support of the Prince George's County Council for the
construction of a	suitable memorial to the victims of the September 11, 2001 attacks on the
United States and to subsequent victims of the war against terrorism.	
WHEREAS	, terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York and the Pentagon in
Virginia claimed	thousands of lives in an undeclared war on the United States; and
WHEREAS, the terrorist attack on the Pentagon killed both civilian and military personnel	
assigned to the Pentagon as well as passengers and crew of the hijacked aircraft used as the	
terrorists' weapon	n; and
WHEREAS	, a significant number of the victims of the attack on the Pentagon were
residents of Maryland and many of those were residents of Prince George's County at the time of	
their deaths; and	
WHEREAS	, Postal Service employees were exposed to deadly strains of anthrax which
resulted in the deaths of two Postal workers from Prince George's County; and	
WHEREAS, additional civilian and military casualties of the on-going war on terrorism	
deserve recognition for their supreme sacrifice in the defense of their country; and	
WHEREAS, the historic Addison graveyard in the Town of Forest Heights, Prince George's	
County is the burial site of the President of the Continental Congress, John Hanson of Maryland,	
and provides a commanding view of the Potomac River; and	

WHEREAS, the Addison graveyard would provide an excellent site for a memorial with

1 high visibility from various locations along the Potomac River, including the Pentagon, 2 approaches to the Woodrow Wilson Interstate 95 Bridge, Mount Vernon, and the Port of 3 Alexandria, Virginia; and 4 WHEREAS, a memorial to the Maryland victims of terrorism should be of sufficient 5 importance, stature and quality to serve as a reminder to generations to come of the price of 6 freedom and as an expression of remembrance of those upon whom the costs of freedom rest. 7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's 8 County, Maryland, that the Council supports the establishment and construction of a suitable 9 memorial to the victims of the September 11, 2001 attacks on the United States and to the 10 subsequent victims of the was against terrorism. 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council supports the placement of the memorial in 12 the Addison graveyard in Forest Heights, Prince George's County in conjunction with the burial 13 site of John Hanson, the President of the Continental Congress. 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Council is directed to forward a copy 15 of this Resolution to members of the Maryland Congressional Delegation, the members of the 16 Prince George's County delegation to the Maryland General Assembly, and the Mayor and Council of the Town of Forest Heights. 17 Adopted this 26th day of March, 2002.
