PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT: Date: 7/2/03

Committee Vote: Favorable, 4-0, (In favor: Councilmembers Exum, Bland, Hendershot and Peters.)

This enabling bill will provide the authority for the County to borrow \$45,788,000 in aggregate for 18 school projects. There is no immediate fiscal impact on the County from bond enabling bills until the projects are incorporated into a bond authorization bill and the bonds are sold. The projects in this bill are included as part of the aggregate total of \$102,484,000 in CB-46-2003. Unlike other bond enabling bills, pursuant to the Charter, legislation authorizing the County to borrow for school projects does not require subsequent approval by the voters.

There should not be any negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of enacting CB-48-2003. The debt service will occur after the bonds are sold in the last quarter of FY2004.
