31.	. "Minority Individuals" are those who have been subjected to prejudice or cultural bias												
because of their identity as a member of a group in terms of race, color, ethnic origin, or gender,													
without regard to their individual capabilities. Minority individuals are limited to members of													
the following groups:													
	a.	a. African Americans (Black Americans), which includes persons having origins in any											
of the Black racial groups of Africa;													
	b.	b. Asian-Pacific Americans, which includes persons whose origins are from Japan, China,											
Taiwan, Korea, Burma (Myanmar), Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia (Kampuchea), Thailand,													
Malaysia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Brunei, Samoa, Guam, the U.S. Trust Territories of the													
Pacific Islands (Republic of Palau), the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands,													
Macao, Fiji, Tonga, Kiribati, Tuvalu, Nauru, Federated States of Micronesia, or Hong Kong;													
	c. Subcontinent Asian Americans, which includes persons whose origins are from India,												
Pakistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, the Maldives Islands, Nepal or Sri Lanka;													
	d. Hispanic Americans, which includes persons of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central												
or South American, or other Spanish or Portuguese culture or origin, regardless of race;													
e. Native Americans, which includes persons who are American Indians, Eskimos,													
Aleuts, or Native Hawaiians; [and]													
	f. Females, regardless of race, ethnicity or origin[.]; and												
g. Veterans and Service Disabled Veterans.													
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
