WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2018 the Prince George's County Family Justice Center saw a

75% increase in clients seeking services related to domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, and elder abuse; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations Declaration on the Elimination of Violence Against Women, adopted in 1993, recognizes the urgent need for the universal application to women of the rights and principles with regard to equality, security, liberty, integrity, and dignity of all human beings; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations Special Rapporteur on Violence Against Women has urged the United States government to reassess existing mechanisms for protecting domestic violence survivors and for punishing abusers, stating that "violence against women is the most pervasive human rights violation which continues to challenge every country in the world, and the U.S. is no exception".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Prince George's County Council joins world leaders and leaders within the United States in recognition of domestic violence as a human rights concern and declares that the freedom from domestic violence is a fundamental human right.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be sent to the County Executive, the Honorable Chairs and Members of the Prince George's County Senate and House Delegations to the Maryland General Assembly, and the Chief of Police.
