PUBLIC SAFETY AND FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 10/10/95

Committee Vote: No Recommendation, 3-0 (In favor: Council Members Estepp, Maloney and Russell.)

This bill will declare 39 parcels to be surplus to the County's needs and approve the County's plan for disposal.

These properties will be sold for no less than the fair market value. The total assessed value for the properties proposed for sale is \$15,428,130.

The legislative officer stated the following:

Three properties listed on Page 5 indicate a "transfer to WMATA" without listing a price of acquisition. Also, since WMATA is not one of the governmental entities identified in subsection (d) a proposed sale price should be included for the properties.

On Page 18, the former Thomas Addison Elementary School property is identified for disposition "back to the Board of Education (BOE)" without identifying the sale price.

The Committee requested information on the cost of Thomas Addison Elementary School with the capital improvements.

The fiscal impact on the County would be positive in an amount equivalent to the sales prices, plus any applicable transfer or recordation taxes.
