LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

FISCAL AND PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT

DATE: 4/16/90

Committee Vote: No Recommendation (In favor: Council Members Castaldi,

Casula and Wineland; Opposed: Council Member Mills)

The Committee voted to not recommend this bill since the fiscal impact statement was not available.

Bruce Crawford, Office of Management & Budget, stated that this legislation would effect only 10-12 employees.

The class study found that a wage adjustment of 4.06% is advisable for those employees in the Deputy Sheriff class series if the County intends to remain competitive in the public safety function.

The Fire Department and the Office of Labor Relations recommend the adoption of this legislation.

The Legislative Officer has reviewed the legislation and find it to be in proper legislative form.

The fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CB-34-1990 will be negative in the amount of \$42,374. This amount represents the compensation adjustments, plus applicable fringe benefit costs, to increase compensation for those employees whose current rate is below entry level of the classification proposed in CB-34-1990.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

The proposed amendments are the result of the Office of Personnel's study of the County's Public Safety classes of work which was conducted pursuant to Personnel Law, Section 16-116 (b) (7). The legislation would upgrade the Cooks and Stewards classes, add a new, two step Fire Inspector classification series; realigning the Firefighter classification series to a three tier series, and delete the Police Cadet classification. The fiscal impact to the County will be provided by the Office of Management and Budget.
