SEC	TION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,			
Maryland, that Section 10-261 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby				
repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:				
	SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.			
	DIVISION 10. ENTERPRISE AND OTHER SPECIAL PURPOSE FUNDS.			
Sec. 10-2	61. Drug Enforcement and Education Special Revenue Fund; establishment.			
(a)	There is hereby created a special revenue fund to be known as the "Drug Enforcement			
and Education Special Revenue Fund" to be administered pursuant to the terms of this Section				
and Section	on 10-248.05 of this Code.			
(b)	The purpose of this Fund shall be to finance costs associated with the administration of

drug enforcement and education activities of the Police Department, the Office of the Sheriff, the Health Department, the Department of Corrections, and the State's Attorney's Office.

- (c) As of July 1, 1989, all proceeds from the forfeiture or sale of property seized under the Annotated Code of Maryland, Criminal Procedure Article, Title 12, or any other drug related property forfeiture law shall be deposited into this Fund.
- (d) Fifteen percent (15%) of the monies in the Drug Enforcement and Education Special Revenue Fund shall be reserved for appropriation to the Prince George's County State's Attorney's Office for its Special Narcotics Prosecution Office. Five percent (5%) of the monies shall be reserved for appropriation to the Prince George's County Health Department for drug prevention and education programs. Fifteen percent (15%) of the monies shall be reserved for appropriation to the Prince George's County Department of Corrections for re-entry and treatment programs for ex-drug offenders. [The remaining sixty-five percent (65%) shall be appropriated to the Prince George's County Police Department for law enforcement activities; provided, however, that sixty-five percent (65%) of the proceeds from property seized by the Office of the Sheriff shall be appropriated to the Office of the Sheriff for law enforcement activities.] Fifteen percent (15%) of the monies shall be reserved for appropriation to the Office of the Sheriff for law enforcement activities. The remaining fifty percent (50%) shall be appropriated to the Prince George's County Police Department for law enforcement activities.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law. All agencies listed as recipients of the Drug Enforcement and Special Revenue Fund shall have 90 days after enactment to report back to the County Council with an implementation plan for the 2026 FY Budget.
