EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS

Police Department

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management, through the Maryland-National Capital Region Emergency Response System awarded \$200,000 for the Virtual Reality Training grant. This program provides funding for classroom-based training and exercises on virtual reality.

Department of Family Services

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$53,319 for the Senior Center Operating Funds program. Funding provides support for senior activities centers. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$619 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Health Department

The U.S. Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration through the Maryland Department of Health awarded \$100,000 for the 988 State and Territory Grant Supplemental program. Funding will support the Maryland's 988 Crisis Hotline System for recruitment and a call taker salary.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$960,000 for the State Crisis System Funding project. Funding will support operational costs related to providing 988 hotline services. Operation costs are associated with information technology management, financial audit, Human Resource Management of 988 staff, phone system costs, equipment and costs associated with 988 program project managers and directors.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$265,640 for the Tobacco Cessation program. Funding will provide training conducted with school staff and teachers during professional development days to educate and update school staff on tobacco and nicotine devises use and their harmful effects on youth, as well as prevention and cessation strategies for students. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$40 is needed to fully expend the award received. The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$3,786,559 for the General Fund Mental Health Grant. This program uses the social work care process of assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation to address the mental health/psychiatric/psychosocial needs of the Mental Health Court (MHC) participants. Funding provides community for mental health programs and services which are not billable under Maryland's Public Behavioral Health System. It also assists in the day-to-day operations of the MHC. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$2,273,942 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$514,028 for the New Cooperative Agreement – 988 State and Territory Improvement program. Funding supports the Local 988 Capacity and improvement to the state and territory response to 988 contacts including calls, chats and texts.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$250,000 for the Integrated Plan Capacity Grant. Funding will address racial inequities, including but not limited to Syndemic Health Conditions (HIV, STI, Hepatitis, and Drug User Health) in Non-Hispanic Blacks in the County. New access points for health disparities and capacity building in Black organizations will be established with these funds.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awarded \$2,999,862 for the Community Health Integration Service System Program. Funding provides salaries and operating costs to support Community Health Workers to build individual and community capacity to improve health knowledge and self-sufficiency. Additional appropriation authority totaling \$2,619,862 is needed to expend the award received.

The Government of the District of Columbia, Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$125,000 for the Urban Security – Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) – Maryland Emergency Response System (MDERS) program. Funding will enhance public health emergency response capabilities in urban areas. Additional appropriation authority totaling \$25,000 is needed to expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$708,950 for the State Opioid Response III

Detention Center MOUD program. Funding ensures offenders being released from the local detention center are referred and engaged in treatment services as well as receive support and housing. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$112,500 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$4,517,714 for the General Fund Services Grant. Funding supports several substances use disorder treatment programs for services supporting recovery outcomes. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$1,000,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$180,000 for the Tobacco Enforcement Initiative. Funding will support conducting annual, random and unannounced inspections of tobacco retail outlets and work to reduce youth access to tobacco by adhering to a requirement that licensed tobacco retailers maintain a Retailer Violation Rate (RVR) of no more than 20%.

Department of Public Works and Transportation

The Maryland State Department of Transportation awarded \$269,105 for the Rideshare Program. The program aims to promote the use of alternatives to single occupancy vehicles such as mass transit, carpools, and vanpools in the County. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$5 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Department of Housing and Community Development

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$2,406,629 to the Home Investment Partnership (HOME) PY32 program. Funding will support a wide range of activities including constructing, acquiring, and/or rehabilitating affordable housing for rent or homeownership or providing direct rental assistance to low-income households. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$58,029 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$5,291,711 to the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) PY49 program. Funding will support a broad range of physical improvements including infrastructure improvements, public housing renovations and modernization, handicapped accessibility improvements, employment and educational training and general assistance to immigrants, the elderly, and people experiencing homelessness. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$214,311 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$446,246 for the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) PY36 program. Funding will support the provision of emergency, transitional, and supportive shelter assistance to the homeless and other temporarily displaced County residents. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$8,546 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Department of the Environment

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Trust Fund awarded \$3,000,000 for the Piscataway Creek Stream Restoration project. This project will restore approximately 6,515 linear feet of Piscataway Creek in Clinton, Maryland, including 3,955 linear feet of an unnamed tributary (UNT); 2,139 linear feet from contributing tributaries; and 421 linear feet from four adjacent drainage channels. The County will provide \$5,259,900 in leveraged funds from the stormwater enterprise fund.

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Trust Fund awarded \$75,000 for the Parker Lane Reforestation Project. This project will reforest and permanently conserve 12.37 acres of active agricultural land under threat of development.
