BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

Home furnishing stores, which include retail uses such as household and office furniture, floor coverings, appliances, electronics and related items, housewares, household accessories, hardware, household textiles, custom home products, and repair and service establishments, are not specifically addressed in the Zoning Ordinance. This legislation will permit this use in the I-1 and I-2 Zones.
