Dear Chair Oriadha:

Enclosed for the County Council's consideration is a Resolution for appropriating funding from grants in the amount of \$15,381,210 for Fiscal Year 2026. This request for additional appropriation authority will support new and/or continuing grant program efforts of eleven agencies. The agencies requesting additional appropriations are listed below.

The Circuit Court will need an adjustment totaling (\$101,047) for three (3) programs. Funding will support a mentoring program for children and teens exposed to trauma and abuse, non-family alternative dispute resolution services and child support enforcement.

The Office of the State's Attorney will need an adjustment totaling (\$963,064) for two (2) programs. Funding will support early intervention for children truancy and safety of victims of sexual assault and domestic violence.

The Police Department will need an adjustment totaling (\$525,959) for ten (10) programs. Funding will help investigate and prosecute online sexual child exploitation crime, reduce motor vehicle carjackings, and dismantle criminal organizations and crime gangs. Funding will also support incentives to recruit professional police officers, overtime to conduct commercial motor vehicle enforcement and inspections, professional development and health and wellness training.

The Fire/EMS Department will need an adjustment totaling (\$195,900) for four (4) programs. Funding will support the purchase of an inflatable boat for water safety, volunteer fire, rescue and ambulance services, the purchase of a cardiac device unit, and cancer screening tests.

The Office of the Sheriff will need an adjustment totaling (\$1,474,253) for three (3) programs. Funding will support a special unit responsible for people in arrears with child support payments, a leadership training course to enhance law enforcement operations, and assistance to ensure the safety of domestic violence victims.

The Office of Homeland Security will need an adjustment totaling (\$1,204,459) for three (3) programs. Funding will support engineering for flood risk mitigation and response to threats and incidents of terrorism in the County.

The Department of the Environment will need an adjustment totaling (\$4,303,207) for five (5) programs. Funding will support the adoption of cats and dogs; the installation of planted medians; veterinary care, sheltering, supplies, marketing and technology for adopted pets; green community activities; and energy efficiency home and building projects for low- and moderate-income residents.

The Department of Family Services will need an adjustment totaling (\$1,592,699) for twenty-two (22) programs. Funding will provide for a single point of contact to assist seniors with aging programs; case management services; nutritional meals for the elderly; efforts of the guardianship program; low-income programs for Medicare beneficiaries; nursing homes for residents with Dementia; paid community services and training for low-income seniors; and training for volunteers to provide health insurance counseling to seniors. Funding also supports administrative costs for the Division of Children, Youth and Families; preventive healthcare services to children and family members; youth employment training; one-to-one mentoring for little brothers and little sister; education for families to create a healthy lifestyle; and the Family Navigator Program.

The Health Department will need an adjustment totaling (\$3,903,911) for fourteen (14) programs. Funding will support education to address medication storage and disposal safety; compliance checks to deter vendors from selling tobacco products to minors; referrals of adults overweight to healthcare partners; treatment and care for HIV clients and immunization services. Funding will also provide non-emergency transportation for eligible residents to their medical appointments; the purchase of blood pressure devices for eligible residents; behavioral health support to students and families; coronavirus disease testing and epidemiologic surveillance; strategies and actions for public health emergencies; mental health services for incarcerated individuals; and administrative support for Local Behavioral Health Authority staff.

The Department of Social Services will need an adjustment totaling (\$846,191) for three (3) programs. Funding will provide training to the Child Advocacy Center; a system-wide standardized assessment of the needs of the unhoused; and educate how to apply for and enroll consumers in the appropriate health insurance.

The Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement will need an adjustment totaling (\$270,520). Funding will support the process to streamline the permitting process for residential solar and solar+ storage systems.
