For the purpose of ea	stablishing the Agricultural Preservation Work Group to review and evaluate
present agricultural j	preservation policies and recommend to the County Council appropriate
revisions to existing	policies and laws.
WHEREAS,	the Rural Tier of Prince George's County, as designated in the 2002
Approved General P	Plan, as amended, encompasses the eastern and southern portions of the
County, in the Patux	ent River, Potomac River, and Mattawoman Creek watersheds, including
171 square miles, ap	proximately 35 percent of the County's land area; and
WHEREAS,	the Rural Tier is the most scenic part of the County, characterized by fine
and diverse landscap	bes, many of the County's remaining farmlands, extensive woodlands and
wetland areas, nume	rous streams and stream valleys, and diverse wildlife habitat; and
WHEREAS,	the main features of the Rural Tier, forests and agricultural lands, present
unique planning, lan	d use, and development issues and policy problems; and
WHEREAS,	during the 2006 Legislative Year, the County Council proposed various
legislation for the pu	rpose of establishing a comprehensive policy on agricultural preservation in
the Rural Tier; and	
WHEREAS,	CB-5-2006, presented on February 14, 2006 and held in committee for
further review, estab	olished a Transfer of Development Rights Program in the County; and

WHEREAS, on June 6, 2006, the County Council adopted CR-47-2006, initiating zoning

WHEREAS, CB-4-2006 and CB-6-2006, enacted on July 18, 2006, established requirements, procedures, and regulations for conservation subdivision design for residentially zoned land located in the Rural Tier; and

WHEREAS, CB-47-2006, enacted on July 18, 2006, established a Purchase of Development Rights (PDR) program to permit the acquisition of conservation easements to extinguish development rights and preserve sensitive natural resources; and

WHEREAS, CB-75-2006, a Zoning Bill for the purpose of establishing an Agricultural Open Space Zone, was presented on August 10, 2006 and later held in committee for further review,

WHEREAS, CR-82-2006, adopted on November 14, 2006, approved the program regulations and procedures for the PDR program; and

WHEREAS, the County Council desires to continue working on a comprehensive policy on agricultural preservation with participation by affected stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, Section 506 of the County Charter provides that the County Council may appoint, for designated periods, temporary citizen advisory boards to assist in the consideration of County policies and programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group is hereby established to review and evaluate present agricultural preservation policies and recommend to the County Council appropriate revisions to existing policies and laws.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group shall be composed of 13 members appointed by the Chairman in consultation with the Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group shall review policies concerning (1) Purchase of Development Rights; (2) Transfer of Development Rights; (3) zoning and development consistent with Rural Tier Preservation; (4) better utilization of Agricultural Preservation Easements and the Rural Legacy Program; and (5) such other preservation measures as the Work Group decides to review and analyze.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agricultural Preservation Work Group shall present its report and recommendations to the County Council on or before March 15, 2007.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council Administrator shall assign appropriate technical and administrative support personnel to assist the Agricultural Preservation Work
