a list of referral agencies. The plan shall be referred to the Prince George's County Police
Department for review and comment at the time of the Subdivision and Development Review
Committee. The Police Department may comment on issues relevant to their mission, including
opportunities to implement crime-prevention measures, and to enhance the safety and security of
residents, employees and other users of a project through implementation of the principles of
Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED).
SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect forty-five
(45) calendar days after its adoption.
