Committee Vote: Favorable, 4-0 (In favor: Council Members Patterson, Campos, Harrison, and Olson)

Staff summarized the purpose of the legislation and informed the committee of referral comments that were received. CB-5-2011 was transmitted by the Planning Board for the County Council's consideration. This legislation amends the Zoning Ordinance concerning the Open Space (O-S) and Residential Agricultural (R-A) Zones to permit a development technique that provides more flexibility for the development of single-family dwellings. CB-5-2011 permits an increase in the maximum lot coverage requirements for lots created pursuant to the Varying Lot Size provisions contained in the Zoning Ordinance.

Alan Hirsch, representing the Planning Board, was present to address the committee and respond to Council Members' questions. Hamer Campbell, of the Maryland-National Capital Building Industry Association, spoke in support of the legislation.

The Office of Law reviewed CB-5-2011 and determined that it is in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its enactment.
