The Committee convened on June 12, 2025, to discuss CR-67-2025, which approves six (6) cameras for four (4) locations for stop sign monitoring systems in the City of District Heights:

District Heights Parkway SW and Rochell Ave - 1 camera

Kipling Pkwy SW and Mason St- 2 cameras

Kipling Pkwy EB and Council Drive - 1 camera

Kipling Pkwy and Marbury Dr - 2 cameras

CR-67-2025 acknowledges that District Heights has:

Sent a letter of request to the County Council (Attachment 1)

Conducted traffic studies at specified locations (Attachment 1)

Passed a local ordinance after a public hearing (Attachment 3)

This resolution implements authority granted by state law (HB-364-2024) and authorized by the passage of CB-84-2024. The County legislation requires the Prince George's County Police Department to provide a report to the Governor and the Maryland General Assembly on or before December 1, 2025, providing details on the stop sign monitoring program, including:

The number of warnings and citations issued

The costs associated with the operation of the systems

Monthly revenue collections

The performance, reliability, and effectiveness of the systems in reducing violations, crashes, and pedestrian injuries

After the discussion, the Committee voted Favorably on CR-67-2025 by a vote of 3-0.
