**LEGISLATIVE HISTORY**COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

Committee Vote: Favorable, 4-0-0 (In favor: Council Members Bell,  
Casula, Pemberton, and Wineland)

The Council was briefed on the purpose of this legislation and that final authorization to expend monies from the Advanced Land Acquisition Fund must come before the Council on a case by case basis.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT**

(Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

This legislation is proposed for the purpose of granting The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission approval of Prince George's County, Maryland, to issue and sell \$5,000,000 of its bonds to

provide funds for advance land acquisition in Prince George's County. The issuance and sale of the bonds has been authorized by the Commission pursuant to Section 7-106(e) of Article 28 of the Maryland Annotated Code, as amended. Section 7-106(e) of Article 28 provides that the Commission must obtain approval of Prince George's County before it may issue and sell such bonds.

The Commission has requested expedition consideration of this bill, CB-29-1990 and CR-20-1990.
