WHEREAS, the Project will make use of green building practices, resulting in one or more of the following categories of projects:

- o Redevelopment of key historic properties in Main Street communities;
- Mixed-use Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) that benefits surrounding communities and encourages transit ridership;
- o Innovative school construction in existing communities;
- o Innovative rehabilitation projects in existing communities;
- Development of mixed-income housing proximate to job centers and desirable schools, including areas benefiting from BRAC-induced growth; and

WHEREAS, additional information in support of this nomination included in the Maryland Smart Sites application attached hereto as Exhibit A (the Application) has also been considered in the deliberation of this nomination; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive, by his signature, expresses approval of the nomination of Greenbelt Middle School Replacement as a Smart Site for participation in the Maryland Smart Sites Initiative; and
