Committee Vote: Favorable 3-0 (In favor Council Members Burroughs, Adams and Oriadha)

The Government Operations and Fiscal Policy Committee met on June 8, 2026, to consider CB-049-2026.

Staff provided an overview stating that CB-049-2026 is a supplementary appropriations bill that provides an additional \$4,053,700 in General Fund spending authority for Local Development Council Community Impact Grants. The funding consists of \$950,000 in miscellaneous receipts from returned Community Impact Grant funds (Memorial Library and No Mo Worries Organization) and \$3,103,700 hundred dollars from the assigned fund balance of the Local Development Council Community Impact Grant Fund. The legislation increases the non-departmental budget to align with a pending Council Resolution that will distribute additional grant funding to eligible recipients.

The Policy Analysis and Fiscal Impact Statement, prepared by Roger Banegas, Legislative Budget and Policy Analyst, was presented by Stephen Turman, Public Service Aide, District 8.

Mr. Banegas's analysis indicated that CB-049-2026 would declare additional revenue and add approximately \$4 million appropriately to the General Fund for costs not anticipated in the approved Fiscal Year 2026 Budget. According to the analysis, the supplemental funding is intended to increase funding for Local Development Council Community Impact Grant programs, noting the additional funding will support youth jobs and apprenticeship programs, youth leadership initiatives, scholarships, and other community-based programs benefiting District 8 residents. The Analysis concludes the legislation is not expected to have a negative fiscal impact on the County because it utilizes funds already available and, if enacted, will take effect 45 days after becoming law.

The Office of Law advised that it had reviewed CB-049-2026 and found no legal impediments to its enactment.

The County Executive's Office indicated support for the legislation.

After discussion, the Government Operations and Fiscal Policy Committee voted favorably 3-0 on CB-049-2026.
