10	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,							
11	Maryland, that Section 26-123 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby							
12	repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

14	DIVISION 8. PARKING REGULATIONS.

17	(a) No person shall park any commercial bus, commercial trailer, trailer, or heavy							
18	commercial truck on any street or highway in the County between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and							
19	6:00 a.m., outside	the corporate lim	nits of any	municipali	ty.

(d) Any owner issued a citation for a violation of this Section shall be subject to a fine of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the first violation, Seven Hundred Fifty (\$750) for the second violation and One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for the third and for any subsequent violations; except that those trailers that are not Commercial Trailers shall be subject to a fine of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each violation and eligible for a separate citation for each twenty-four (24) hour period such trailer is in violation of this Section.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
