Braveboy Climate Leadership Summit


- Goals of the Summit:

Climate 101 for County Employees

- Made in partnership with OHRM
- Now available on NEOGov for all County employees
- Pending OHRM Director and CAO approval, Climate 101 will be made mandatory for all employees in January 2026





Resilience Hubs

- Resilience hubs support residents before, during, and after local climaterelated events.
- Hubs serve as coordination points for communications, distributing resources, building community cohesion, and advancing climate mitigation and adaptation goals year-round.
- County-based resilience hubs are being planned for Hyattsville Library and Colin Powell Academy.
- Small grants are being planned for community-based organizations through Chesapeake Bay Trust to implement resilient hubs.

April 2022: County Council adopted the County's Draft Climate Action Plan (CAP) March 2024: Task Force approved 12 out of 17 total strategies listed in the Climate Action Implementation Strategy Plan (CAISP) May 2025:

October 2025: CED website subdomain went live
















May 2022: Executive Order No. 5-2022 authorized creation of a Climate Action Implementation Task Force



July 2025: DoE's Climate and Energy Division (CED) established




FY26 Climate Action Implementation Strategy Priorities

- Finalize the Climate Action Plan (CAP) and release the Climate Action Implementation Strategy Plan
- Continue a Whole-of-Government Approach to operationalize the CAISP with the Interagency Climate Committee (ICC)
- 3. Host the Braveboy Climate Leadership Summit
- 4. Launch an Employee Climate Literacy Campaign
- 5. Develop a climate-ready budget
- 6. Develop a Resilience Hub network
- 7. Measure and Reduce Employee Vehicle Miles Traveled
- 8. Lead by Example by Greening County Operations



Prince George's County Climate Action Plan (CAP)



- Outlines 26 Priority Recommendations to 50% reduction of community-wide greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 (compared with 2005 levels)
- Needs to be finalized by County Council
- Recommendations include:
 - Commitment to clean and renewable energy
 - 2. Integrating climate resilience criteria into long-range County plans, policies, and CIP programs
 - 3. Meaningful, equitable community engagement
 - 4. Resilient and green building codes and standards
 - 5. Leading by example in County Operations


PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY CLIMATE ACTION

- Based on the CAP, and is practical, actionable, and relatable to the terms, metrics, and outcomes of the County government.
- Serves as a "roadmap" to operationalize the Climate Action Plan and achieve our emissions reduction goals.
- Divided into three overarching strategies –
 Leadership, Mitigation and Adaptation.
- Needs to be approved by CEX and released to the public.
