Committee Vote, Favorable, 5-0, (In favor: Councilmembers Exum, Bland, Hendershot, Knotts and Peters).

This legislation will declare 14 parcels of County-owned property as surplus to the County's need and the disposition of these parcels by sale, transfer or otherwise.

Two parcels will be transferred by the County: Map 6-B to the Washington Metropolitan Transit Authority and Map 7-B to the Maryland-National Capitol Park and Planning Commission. The remaining twelve parcels, with a total assessed value of \$360,236, are to be sold for not less than the fair market value.

Members of the Committee expressed their concerns with Map 6-B which would transfer property from the County to the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA). They voted to delete Map 6-B, thereby not approving the transfer to WMATA.

There should be a positive fiscal impact on the County when the twelve parcels are sold and returned to the County's real property tax rolls as a result of adopting CR-72-2003.
