The Prince	George's County Solid Waste Advisory Commission is established to provide	
community input, guidance and advice to the County Executive and County Council on matters		
relating to solid waste management within the County.

1 Sec. 21-125.02. Powers and duties of Commission. 2 (a) The Commission shall have the power and duty to: (1) Review and offer recommendations on the ten-year solid waste management plan 3 4 for the County; 5 (2) Investigate, prepare fiscal impact statements, and make recommendations on 6 systematic programs and alternative methods, both public and private, for the storage, collection, 7 transportation, processing, disposal and resource recovery of solid waste, including sludge; 8 (3) Evaluate the impact of the solid waste management program on citizens, 9 institutions, businesses and industries throughout the County; 10 (4) Recommend methods to assure public involvement in solid waste planning and develop educational programs to inform the public on all aspects of solid waste management; 11 12 (5) Recommend local and state legislation necessary to accomplish effective solid 13 waste management; 14 (6) Review and comment on the annual County budget for solid waste activities; and 15 (7) Submit to the County Executive and County Council, and make available to the 16 general public, an annual report of the activities of the Commission. 17 Sec. 21-125.03. Commission composition; term; officers. 18 (a) The Commission shall be composed of fifteen (15) members appointed by the County 19 Executive and subject to the confirmation by the County Council. At least five (5) of the 20 appointments, one of whom shall be designated as the vice chairman, shall be selected from alist 21 of persons submitted by the County Council. One ex-officio member may be appointed by the 22 County Executive and one ex-officio member may be appointed by the County Council. 23 Members shall be selected so as to represent broad geographic areas of the County, the solid 24 waste industry, business users and the general public. 25 (b) The term of office for each member shall be three (3) years; however, the terms of the 26 initial appointments shall be staggered with five (5) members appointed to three (3) year terms, 27 five (5) members appointed to two (2) year terms, and five (5) members appointed to one (1) 28 year terms. 29 (c) The County Executive shall designate two (2) members to serve as chairman and vice 30 chairman. The Commission members shall elect annually from their own membership such other officers as it deems necessary. Staff support shall be provided by the Department of 31
