Committee Vote: Favorable, 4-0 (In favor: Council Members Dean, Dernoga, Peters and Shapiro)

Staff summarized the purpose of CR-22-2003 and referral comments that were received. The resolution urges Federal officials to retain authority with the state and local governments to protect residents from predatory lending practices.

Written comments were provided by the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN) in support of the resolution.

Two members of ACORN spoke in support of CR-22-2003 sharing personal experiences with predatory lending.

Terrance Taylor, representing Congressman Steny Hoyer, spoke in support and express the Congressman's willingness to cooperatively work with the County in their endeavors in this effort.

Delegate JoAnne Benson spoke in support of CR-22-2003 and discussed her work on the state level.
