BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

Private home detention service providers are not regulated currently. The proposed resolution requests the Governor and the County Delegation to the General Assembly to enact into law appropriate regulations and establish appropriate standards for the release of criminal defendants into the custody of private for profit home detention operators and to adopt administrative regulations to establish minimum standards of operation for private for profit home detention operators.
