	Transgender Day of Remembrance
For the purpose	of recognizing Transgender Day of Remembrance 2020 and affirming the right
of transgender in	ndividuals to live with peace, dignity, and respect.
WHEREAS	S, Transgender Day of Remembrance 2020 is being recognized on November 2020.
2020 across the	country; and
WHEREAS	S, in 1998 Rita Hester, a transgender woman of color was murdered, and her
murder has yet to	o be solved; and
WHEREAS	S, in 1999, the following year Gwendolyn Ann Smith created the first
Transgender Day	y of Remembrance in honor of Rita Hester and other transgender people who loss
their lives to vio	lence; and
WHEREAS	S, at least 26 transgender and gender non-conforming individuals were murdered
in 2019, includir	ng at least 2 transgender women in Prince George's County, and 91% of these
victims were Bla	ack women; and
WHEREAS	S, at least 36 transgender and gender non-conforming individuals have been
murdered in 202	0 to date, the highest number on record; and
WHEREAS	S, according to the National Center for Transgender Equality's U.S. Transgender
Survey, which in	ncluded over 28,000 respondents, 47% of all Black respondents and 30% of
Latino responde	nts reported being denied equal treatment, verbally harassed, and/or physically
attacked in the p	revious year because of being transgender; and
WHEREA	S, according to the same survey, nearly 57% of respondents were afraid to go to

the police when they needed help and 58% of transgender people who interacted with law

enforcement reported experiences of harassment, abuse or other mistreatment; and

WHEREAS, according to the same survey, over 81% of respondents reported seriously thinking about suicide in their lifetime and over 40% reported attempting suicide at some point in their lifetime; and

WHEREAS, according to a poll by NPR, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and Harvard University, 31% of transgender Americans lack regular access to healthcare and 22% of transgender people said they have avoided doctors or health care for fear of being discriminated against; and

WHEREAS, one in five transgender people in the United States have been discriminated against when seeking a home, more than one in ten have been evicted from their homes because of their gender identity, and one in five transgender individuals have experienced homelessness at some point in their lives; and

WHEREAS, over one in five transgender adults has one or more chronic condition, such as diabetes, arthritis, or asthma, and transgender individuals are more likely to be living with HIV, placing them at higher risk for contracting COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Prince George's County government to protect and preserve the lives of all residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Prince George's County Council joins Americans across the country affirming the rights and dignity of transgender individuals.
