## HEALTH, EDUCATION & HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE

Committee Voted: Favorable with Amendments, 3-0 (In favor: Council Members Bailey, MacKinnon, Scott and Wilson).

Date: 9/11/96

This is a Code cleanup bill to bring the County into compliance with the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Fair Housing Amendment Act. The County's Code in this area predates ADA regulations. The intent here is to prevent litigation against the County for non-compliance with Federal Regulations.

The Legislative Officer proposed two amendments, requiring a Draft 2. After brief discussion, the Committee concurred with the suggested amendments and supported a Draft 2.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

This legislation will amend the requirements for the admission of a resident to a congregate living facility and require the Health Officer to make certain assessments as to the appropriateness of congregate living for residents.
