ZONING BILL

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 Cannabis Uses

3 For the purpose of adding definitions and designating areas for Cannabis uses consistent with
4 authority set forth in State law; prohibiting On-site cannabis consumption uses; setting forth
5 regulations for permitted Cannabis uses; providing parking regulations for Cannabis uses;
6 providing for the prospective application of provisions and amendments adopted herein; and
7 providing a severability clause for the provisions related to Cannabis uses in Prince George's
8 County.

9 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

10 Sections 27-11001, 27-2500, 27-5101, 27-5102, 27-5402,
11 and 27-6305,

12 The Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland,
13 being also

14 SUBTITLE 27. ZONING.

15 The Prince George's County Code
16 (2019 Edition; 2022 Supplement).

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
18 Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional
19 District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that Sections 27-11001, 27-2500, 27-5101, 27-
20 5102, 27-5402, and 27-6305 of the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland,

1 being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, be and the same are hereby repealed
2 and reenacted with the following amendments:

3 **SUBTITLE 27. ZONING.**

4 **PART 27-1. GENERAL PROVISIONS.**

5 **SECTION 27- 11000. REGULATIONS APPLICABLE IN ALL ZONES.**

6 **Sec. 27-11001. Prohibited Uses.**

7 (a) The following uses are prohibited in all zones:

8 (1) The display or sale of drug paraphernalia.

9 (A) "Drug Paraphernalia" means all equipment, products, and materials of any
10 kind which, in violation of Title 5, Criminal Law Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, are used
11 in:

12 (i) planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing,
13 compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging,
14 repackaging, storing, containing, or concealing a controlled dangerous substance; or

15 (ii) injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human
16 body a controlled dangerous substance [in violation of Subheading Health-Controlled Dangerous
17 Substances, Article 27, Annotated Code of Maryland. "Drug Paraphernalia" includes:]

18 [i.Kits used in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, or harvesting of
19 any species of plant which is a controlled dangerous substance or from which a controlled
20 dangerous substance can be derived];

21 [ii.Kits used in manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing,
22 processing, or preparing controlled dangerous substances;]

23 [iii.Isomerization devices used in increasing the potency of any species of
24 plant which is a controlled dangerous substance;]

25 [iv.Testing equipment used in identifying or analyzing the strength,
26 effectiveness, or purity of controlled dangerous substances;]

27 [v.Scales and balances used in weighing or measuring controlled dangerous
28 substances;]

29 [vi.Dilutants and adulterants, such as quinine hydrochloride, mannitol,
30 mannite, dextrose, and lactose, used in cutting controlled dangerous substances;]

31 [vii.Separation gins and sifters used in cleaning or refining marijuana:]

1 [viii.Blenders, bowls, containers, spoons, and mixing devices used in
2 compounding controlled dangerous substances;]

3 [ix.Capsules, balloons, envelopes, and other containers used in packaging
4 small quantities of controlled dangerous substances;]

5 [x.Containers and other objects used in storing or concealing controlled
6 dangerous substances;]

7 [xi.Hypodermic syringes, needles, and other objects used in parenterally
8 injecting controlled dangerous substances into the human body;]

9 [xii.Objects used for ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing marijuana,
10 cocaine, hashish, or hashish oil into the human body, such as:]

11 [(aa) Metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic, or ceramic pipes,
12 with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads, or punctured metal bowls;]

13 [(bb) Water pipes;]

14 [(cc) Carburetion tubes and devices;]

15 [(dd) Smoking and carburetion masks;]

16 [(ee) Roach clips (meaning objects used to hold burning material, such
17 as a marijuana cigarette, that has become too small or too short to be held in the hand);]

18 [(ff) Miniature cocaine spoons and cocaine vials;]

19 [(gg) Chamber pipes;]

20 [(hh) Carburetor pipes;]

21 [(ii) Electric pipes;]

22 [(jj) Air-driven pipes;]

23 [(kk) Chilams;]

24 [(ll) Bongs; and]

25 [(mm) Ice pipes or chillers.]

26 **(B)** In determining whether an object is drug paraphernalia, a court or other
27 authority shall consider, in addition to all other logically relevant factors, the [following:]-factors
28 in Title 5, Criminal Law Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

29 [(i) Statements by an owner or by anyone in control of the object
30 concerning its use;]

1 [(ii) Prior convictions (if any) of an owner or anyone in control of the
2 object, under any State or Federal law relating to any controlled dangerous substance;]

3 [(iii) The proximity of the object, in time and space, to a direct
4 violation of Subheading Health-Controlled Dangerous Substances, Article 27, Annotated Code
5 of Maryland;]

6 [(iv) The proximity of the object to controlled dangerous substances;]

7 [(v) The existence of any residue of controlled dangerous substances
8 on the object;]

9 [(vi) Direct or circumstantial evidence of the intent of an owner, or of
10 anyone in control of the object, to deliver it to persons whom he knows, or should reasonably
11 know, intend to use the object to facilitate a violation of Subheading Health-Controlled
12 Dangerous Substances, Article 27, Annotated Code of Maryland. The innocence of an owner, or
13 of anyone in control of the object, as to a direct violation of that Subheading shall not prevent a
14 finding that the object is used as drug paraphernalia;]

15 [(vii) Instructions, oral or written, provided with the object concerning
16 its use;]

17 [(viii) Descriptive materials accompanying the object which explain or
18 depict its use;]

19 [(ix) National and local advertising concerning its use;]

20 [(x) The manner in which the object is displayed for sale;]

21 [(xi) Whether the owner, or anyone in control of the object, is a
22 legitimate supplier of similar or related items to the community, such as a licensed distributor or
23 dealer of tobacco products;]

24 [(xii) Direct or circumstantial evidence of the ratio of sales of the
25 object to the total sales of the business enterprise;]

26 [(xiii) The existence and scope of legitimate uses for the object in the
27 community; or]

28 [(xiv) Expert testimony concerning its use.]

29 (C) The definitions contained in [Article 27, Section 277, Annotated Code of
30 Maryland] Title 5, Criminal Law Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, are a part of this Section
31 to the same extent as if they were fully described in the Section.

PART 27-2. INTERPRETATION AND DEFINITIONS.

SECTION 27-2500. DEFINITIONS.

* * * * *

[Medical cannabis] Cannabis

[Any product containing usable cannabis or usable medical cannabis finished product.]

(a)The plant Cannabis Sativa L. and any part of the plant, including all derivatives, extracts, cannabinoids, isomers, acids, salts, and salts of isomers, whether growing or not, with a Delta-9-TetraHydrocannabinol concentration of greater than 0.3% on a dry weight basis.

(b)“Cannabis” includes Cannabis products.

(C)“Cannabis” does not include “hemp “ or “hemp products,” as defined in Agriculture Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

* * * * *

[Medical cannabis dispensary] Cannabis dispensary

[An entity licensed under Subtitle 33 of the Health – General Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, that acquires, possesses, repackages, processes, transfers, transports, sells, distributes, or dispenses products containing usable medical cannabis, related supplies, or related products, including tinctures, aerosols, oils, or ointments; or provides educational materials for use by a qualifying patient or caregiver.]

A use which entails acquiring, possessing, repackaging, transferring, selling, distributing, or dispensing Cannabis or Cannabis products, including tinctures, aerosols, oils, and ointments, related supplies, and educational materials for use by a qualifying patient, caregiver, or adult over the age of 21 through a storefront. Cannabis dispensary also includes a former medical cannabis dispensary that converted its license to allow for the sale of both medical and adult use cannabis pursuant to Alcoholic Beverages & Cannabis Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

* * * * *

[Medical cannabis finished product] Cannabis finished product

A product containing a [medical] cannabis concentrate or a [medical] cannabis-infused product packaged and labeled for release to a qualifying patient , caregiver, or adult over the age of 21.

* * * * *

[Medical cannabis grower and/or processor] Cannabis grower

1 [A medical cannabis grower is an entity licensed under Subtitle 33 of the Health – General
2 Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, that cultivates, manufactures, packages, processes, or
3 distributes medical cannabis to licensed processors, licensed dispensaries, or registered
4 independent testing laboratories. A medical cannabis processor is an entity licensed under
5 Subtitle 33 of the Health – General Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, that transforms
6 medical cannabis into another product or extract, and packages and labels medical cannabis.]

7 A use that entails cultivating or packaging cannabis, as well as providing cannabis to other
8 Cannabis uses and registered independent testing laboratories. Cannabis grower also includes a
9 former medical cannabis grower that converted its license to allow for the growing of Cannabis
10 for medical and adult use pursuant to the Alcoholic Beverages & Cannabis Article, Annotated
11 Code of Maryland.

12 * * * * *

13 **Cannabis incubator**

14 An entity licensed under the Alcoholic Beverages & Cannabis Article, Annotated Code of
15 Maryland, to operate a facility within which Cannabis micro-dispensaries; Cannabis micro-
16 growers; and/or Cannabis processors may operate.

17 **Cannabis micro-dispensary**

18 A use that entails acquiring, possessing, repackaging, transferring, selling, distributing, or
19 dispensing Cannabis or Cannabis products, including tinctures, aerosols, oils, and ointments,
20 related supplies, and educational materials for use by a qualifying patient, caregiver, or adult
21 over the age of 21 solely through a delivery service or transport. Cannabis micro-dispensary is
22 limited to ten (10) employees and may not have a physical storefront.

23 **Cannabis micro-grower**

24 A use that entails cultivating or packaging no more than 10,000 square feet of indoor
25 cannabis canopy or 40,000 square feet of outdoor cannabis canopy, as well as providing cannabis
26 to other Cannabis uses and registered independent testing laboratories.

27 **Cannabis micro-processor**

28 A use that entails transforming no more than 1,000 pounds of Cannabis per year into
29 another product or extract, packaging and labeling the Cannabis product, and providing Cannabis
30 to other Cannabis uses and registered independent testing laboratories.

31 **Cannabis on-site consumption establishment**

1 A use that entails distributing Cannabis or Cannabis products for on-site consumption other
2 than consumption by smoking indoors.

3 **Cannabis Processor**

4 a use that entails transforming Cannabis into another product or extract, Packaging and
5 labeling the cannabis product, and providing Cannabis to other Cannabis uses and registered
6 independent testing laboratories. Cannabis processor also includes a former Medical cannabis
7 processor that converted its license to allow for the processing of Cannabis for medical and adult
8 use pursuant to Alcoholic Beverages & Cannabis Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.
