


### **Changes in Federal Outlays 1962-2023**

### Affordable Care Act Marketplace (MHBE)1

- Increased complexity for enrollment, reenrollment and eligibility complicate consumer access to insurance;
- Reduces eligibility of categories of legally present non-citizens for premium tax credits;
- Increases premiums through changes in the formula to calculate premium tax credits;
- Allows the enhanced premium tax credit, enacted during COVID to expire, raising premiums 12%-17%
