BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:

This Resolution provides for the continuation of certain military leave benefits and the eligibility requirements for certain military leave benefits for County employees called to active duty as a result of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, the war on terrorism and/or military action in Iraq and Afghanistan. The benefits provided by this Resolution shall continue as provided by CR-10-2015. These benefits shall expire two years from the effective date of this legislation.
