**RESOLUTION**

1 A RESOLUTION concerning

2 The Revised Elderly Property Tax Credit

3 For the purpose of delaying the effective date of CB-007-2024 – The Revised Elderly Property  
4 Tax Credit, and to provide the necessary time to revise CB-007-2024 and enact legislation that  
5 clarifies the senior citizens eligibility for a senior tax credit.

6 WHEREAS, on June 28, 2022, the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland  
7 adopted CB-29-2022, which established a Property Tax Credit for Elderly Individuals; and

8 WHEREAS, on February 27, 2024, the County Council of Prince George's County,  
9 Maryland presented legislation (CB-007-2024) to revise the elderly tax credit to make it  
10 available to certain senior citizens exclusive of and separate and distinct from the Homestead and  
11 Maryland's Homeowner's Property Tax Credit; and

12 WHEREAS, on November 12, 2024, the County Council adopted CB-007-2024, with  
13 amendments, after holding a public hearing; and

14 WHEREAS, after subsequent review and consultation with the Office of Finance, several  
15 provisions in CB-007-2024 must be clarified to identify the senior citizens eligible for a senior  
16 tax credit; and

17 WHEREAS, prior to the enactment of CB-007-2024, by the enactment of CB-29-2022, the  
18 Office of Finance was provided unambiguous language as to the seniors eligible for a senior tax  
19 credit; and

20 WHEREAS, a revised act is required to clarify the terms of the senior tax credit and to  
21 provide clear direction to the Office of Finance and to the public as to those seniors that are  
22 eligible for a tax credit; and

1 WHEREAS, as a result, on February 11, 2025, The County Council extended the effective  
2 date of CB-007-2024 to June 30, 2025; and

3 WHEREAS, due to the increased complexity of the task of clarifying the terms of the senior  
4 tax credit, the effective date of CB-007-2024 needs to be further extended; and

5 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1017(c) of the Prince George’s County Charter, a  
6 resolution has the force and effect of law but of a temporary or administrative character.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George’s  
8 County, Maryland, that CB-007-2024 and CB-029-2022, shall be suspended until further  
9 amendment to CB-007-2024; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive, through the Council Chair, may  
11 submit proposed curative legislation to the Council for consideration; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect December 31, 2026,  
13 absent further legislative action by the County governing body.
