#### **EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS**

#### **Health Department**

The Maryland State Department of Education, Division of Special Education/Early Intervention Services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the Consolidated Local Implementation Grant awarded \$204,444 in additional funding to the Infants and Toddlers Program. The Infants and Toddlers Program provides families with early intervention services targeted to infants and toddlers who have a developmental delay, a diagnosed condition (i.e. Down Syndrome, Austin, or Cerebral Palsy) or who may be at risk for developmental delay as a result of a high-risk condition.

The Laurel-Beltsville Oasis Youth and Family Services program received \$30,000 in additional funding from the Department of Family Services to provide substance abuse and referral services, suicide prevention and crisis intervention counseling for individuals, families and groups. This program serves children under the age of 17 and their families.

The Maryland Community Health Resources Commission, Electronic Health Records System awarded \$75,000 to support efforts to develop and implement an information technology system for the Health Department's nine health centers.

The Maryland Hospital Association, State Improvement Process awarded \$75,000 to provide infrastructure to establish the Local Health Improvement Coalition. The Coalition includes Doctor's Community Hospital, Fort Washington Medical Center, Laurel Regional Hospital, Prince George's Hospital Center and Southern Maryland Hospital. Start-up funds include salary costs for three Health Department staff designated by the Health Officer to oversee and direct Prince George's Health Action Planning Coalition operations, a contract with an external consultant to plan and facilitate monthly meetings, materials for community engagement/public information, and anticipated needs assessment within the County's targeted zip codes.

#### Fire/EMS Department

The Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS), awarded \$37,100 for the purchase of pediatric transport equipment consistent with the current National Highway

Traffic Safety Administration recommendations. This grant will support the purchase of 70 Ferno Pedi-Mate restraints and 70 Safeguard Transport devices.

The Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS) awarded \$43,350 through the Radio Cost Reimbursement program. Funding will be used for the purchase and installation of 51 Mobile APX 7500 Dual Head, Dual Mode mobile radios and supporting materials. Each mobile radio will be programmed with the MIEMSS approved channel template and installed in a public safety ambulance or support vehicle in accordance with industry standards without modification and in a manner which affords easy access for maintenance, testing, and repair.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$584,996 through the Urban Areas Security Initiative Emergency Medical Services Patient Tracking Grant. Funding will support the ongoing process to build a region-wide patient tracking system. EMS providers will be able to enter patient information on a daily basis from hand-held mobile computers and hospitals will be alerted of patients intended for arrival. In the event of a mass casualty incident, the system will be used to distribute patients to the most available hospitals.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$870,000 through the Urban Areas Security Initiative Metropolitan Medical Response System. Funding will support the integration of emergency management, health, and medical systems into a coordinated response to mass casualty incidents caused by any hazard. This system will augment existing local operational response systems. A training platform to ensure responder familiarization with the plans will be purchased as well as pharmaceuticals and equipment to ensure the multiagency response to a catastrophic incident.

#### **Police Department**

The Byrne Justice Grant, Cross Border Initiative, in the amount of \$14,853, will support overtime for sworn personnel to assist in monitoring adult and juvenile offenders under supervised parole and probation sentenced by the District of Columbia, but reside in the County.

### **Department of Housing and Community Development**

The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development, Rental Allowance Program awarded \$188,306 to provide flat rent subsidies to low-income families who either are homeless or have an emergency housing need. The goal of this program is to enable these households to move from homelessness or temporary emergency housing into more permanent housing and the return to self-sufficiency. Eligible residents are low-income families who are homeless, in danger of becoming homeless, or in need of emergency housing.

### Office of the State's Attorney

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention through the Domestic Violence Support Grant Program awarded \$7,000 for the local Domestic Violence Victim Advocate Program. This program increases outreach to victims prior to court and increases the number of cases successfully prosecuted while maintaining safety. Grants funds provide salary support for one prosecutor and one domestic violence coordinator.

## Office of the Sheriff

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention through the Violence Against Women Grant Program awarded \$4,129 for the local Domestic Violence Coordinating Council. The program will support projects that enhance and build capacity, demonstrate strong partnerships and develop education, training and advocacy initiatives that support efforts to combat domestic violence and sexual assault.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention through the Violence Against Women Grant Program awarded additional funding in the amount of \$635 for the Domestic Violence Special Assistant program. Funding supports a community developer position that oversees intervention for domestic violence victims, provides immediate intervention and safety planning, court accompaniment, and connection to resources.

#### **Department of Family Services**

The Maryland Department of Aging, Ombudsman Initiative awarded additional funding in the amount of \$939. The purpose of this program is to investigate and resolve non-medical

complaints made by residents or others on behalf of residents ensuring the patient's Bill of Rights is upheld.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded additional funding in the amount of \$9,276 for the Medicaid Waiver Administrative and Case Management program. This program provides Medicaid payments to eligible adults aged 50 and older for in-home services or assisted living facilities as an alternative to nursing home placement.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded additional funding in the amount of \$23,574 for the Title III-C1 Nutrition/Congregate Meals Program. This program provides meals to residents aged 60 and over at locations throughout the County. In addition to mandated services, the program provides nutrition screening, social, recreational, health and fitness activities.

The Maryland Department of Aging, Title III-B Area Agency on Aging awarded additional funding in the amount of \$2,151. An integral function of the Area Agency is to distribute funds to various agencies furnishing a variety of services, including legal assistance, information and referral, day care for the frail, health fitness, rural outreach, tax assistance, foster-home care, respite care and ombudsman services.

The Maryland Department of Aging, Title III-E Caregiving/Older American Acts awarded additional funding in the amount of \$513. Funds are used for providing services to caregivers through existing programs. Services to caregivers include information, assistance, individual counseling, training, respite care, supplemental services and organization of support groups.

The Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene awarded additional funding in the amount of \$58,116 for the Shelter Plus Care Grant. Funds are used to provide rental assistance payments for homeless mentally ill individuals and/or their families who may be involved with the criminal justice system.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$60,000 for the Senior Center Operating Fund.

This grant will provide for oral health promotion and education at five senior activity centers in

the County. In addition, through this grant, the local Health Department will provide dental assessment and treatment to 25 seniors residing in Prince George's County.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$100,700 for the Maryland Access Point (MAP). The purpose of the grant is to work towards the goals of becoming a fully-functioning Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC). Funding will enhance the current Aging Services Division data software to include co-located partners; purchase three (3) computers; contract with a marketing firm to develop promotional items to distribute in the community; install automatic doors to the bathrooms to increase accessibility and hire staff to assist with consolidating reports and intakes as well as re-establishing a stakeholder group to address gaps in services and the needs of the community.

## **Department of Social Services**

The Maryland State Department of Education awarded additional funding in the amount of \$82,700 for the Child and Adult Food Care Program. This grant will ensure children in shelters receive nutritious meals.

The Zanvyl and Isabelle Krieger Fund awarded \$10,140 for the Krieger Strengthening Family Program to support at-risk families impacted by the trauma of poverty, violence, substance abuse, and a chronic family dysfunction. This grant is earmarked for the purchase of materials, food, training and supervision to support the agency's implementation of "Structuring Family Coping Resources."

The Maryland Department of Human Resources awarded additional funding in the amount of \$4,500 for the Maryland Emergency Food Assistance Program. This grant provides short term food assistance to eligible individuals and families through soup kitchens food pantries, shelters, food banks, residential treatment programs and after-school programs.

#### **Office of Homeland Security**

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded additional funding in the amount of \$15,881 through the Urban Areas Security Initiative for the

Volunteer and Citizen Corps Program. This grant will be used to help Volunteer and Donations Management programs educate, train and prepare citizens and communities for real world disasters.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$1,382,000 through the Urban Areas Security Initiative for the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) Interoperability project. This grant will enable Prince George's County and Montgomery County to connect the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) systems of both counties to reduce emergency response time to the citizens.

The Maryland Emergency Management Agency awarded \$2,137 for Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) Training. Funding will be used to implement FY 2012 Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) training to meet the guidelines of the National Standard curriculum as determined by Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS).

The Maryland Emergency Management Agency awarded additional funding in the amount of \$372 for the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG). The purpose of the program is to assist State, Local, and Tribal governments in preparing for all hazards, as authorized by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.). Title VI of the Stafford Act authorizes FEMA to make grants for the purpose of providing a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property in the United States from hazards and to vest responsibility for emergency preparedness jointly in the Federal Government and the States and their political subdivisions. The Federal Government, through the EMPG Program, provides necessary direction, coordination, and guidance, and provides necessary assistance, as authorized in this title so that a comprehensive emergency preparedness system exists for all hazards. Prince George's County with the approval from the state's granting agency which is MEMA uses EMPG funds to support a portion of salary reimbursements for Emergency Management staff in accordance with the above purpose.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$989,607 through the Urban Areas Security Initiative for Emergency Operations

Communications Enhancement. Funding has been provided to enhance Prince George's County Office of Emergency Management emergency operation communications. Funding also provide for the purpose of paying for lease space for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Enhanced Conventional Weapons (CBRNE) equipment purchased with grant funds, support a paging systems (communications system), and funding to support equipment purchases specific to the County's Emergency Operations Center.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$520,450 through the Urban Areas Security Initiative for Public Safety Emergency Notification Enhancement. Funding has been provided to improve the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activation and stand-up efficiency, enhance work areas, communications capability, and information technology.

The District of Columbia through the County of Fairfax, Virginia awarded \$501,245 for the Maryland GIS Index System. Funding has been provided to maintain and enhance the operations of the Index System through regional geospatial data exchange of crime incident data between Prince George's County, Montgomery County and Frederick County.
