BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Local Diverse Supplier Prime Contractor Program

3 For the purpose of establishing a Local Diverse Supplier Prime Contractor Program to increase
4 opportunities for local diverse suppliers in public procurement prime contracting; requiring
5 certain reporting to the County Council; providing for exemptions and public notice of
6 solicitations for procurements; and generally relating to the Local Diverse Supplier Prime
7 Contractor Program.

8 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

9 SUBTITLE 10A. PURCHASING.

10 Section 10A-161,

11 The Prince George's County Code

12 (2023 Edition; 2025 Supplement).

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
14 Maryland, that Section 10A-161 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
15 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

16 SUBTITLE 10A. PURCHASING.

17 DIVISION 7. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

18 SUBDIVISION 1. COUNTY-BASED SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

19 **Sec. 10A-161. County-based business participation requirements.**

20 * * * * *

21 (l) Local Diverse Supplier Prime Contractor Program.

1 (1) The Purchasing Agent shall reserve at least 20% of the aggregate value of
2 procurements awarded each fiscal year by all units of the County Government, including at least
3 20% of all construction-related procurements awarded, solely for bids, proposals, and awards for
4 prime bidders, prime proposers, and prime contractors that are

5 (A) Locally Owned and Operated Businesses or

6 (B) County-Based Minority Business Enterprises.

7 (2) Reporting, Exemptions, and Public Notice.

8 (A) Reporting. By August 1st of each year, the Purchasing Agent shall transmit in
9 writing to the Clerk of the County Council for distribution to County Council Members:

10 (i) a list of procurements selected to be subject to the requirements of this
11 Subsection during the fiscal year; and

12 (ii) a summary and analysis of the outcome of the awarded procurements reserved
13 in accordance with this Subsection for the previous fiscal year.

14 (B) Exemption. If the Purchasing Agent determines that a procurement listed in
15 accordance with Subparagraph (A), above, is no longer suitable for reservation in the Local
16 Diverse Supplier Prime Contractor Program accordance with this Subsection, the procurement
17 can be removed from reservation upon adoption of an approving County Council resolution,
18 provided that the Purchasing Agent receives approval in the same Council resolution of one or
19 more additional procurements that replace the procurement value of the exempted procurement,
20 which shall be included in the reserved procurements for that fiscal year in accordance with this
21 Subsection.

22 (C) Public notice. Any solicitations for procurements reserved for the Local Diverse
23 Supplier Prime Contractor Program in accordance with this Subsection shall be made publicly
24 available without cost or subscription on a website maintained by the Office of Procurement at
25 the time of solicitation of bids or proposals.

26 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
27 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
28 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
29 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
30 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
31 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such

2 | or section.

3 | SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
4 | calendar days after it becomes law.
