


Overall Cancer Disease Mortality Rates








Specific Cancer Sites-Mortality Rates











Regional impact

- getting care in one place vs. making multiple trips to different places leads to improved patient compliance
- Community Event Interventions directly correlates to increased screenings, awareness, and long-term outcomes of decreased incidences of cancer, mortalities and disparities

State impact
