For the purpose of	of supporting an affirmative right to vote; restoring Section 4 of the Voting	
Rights Act of 1965; supporting the full representation and voting rights of District of Columbia		
residents in the House of Representatives and in the United States Senate; improving election		
practices; increas	sing voter participation; and generally relating to voting.	
WHEREAS	S, voter turnout in Prince George's County was 68.19% of registered voters in	
the 2012 Preside	ntial Election and 47.57% of registered voters in the 2010 Gubernatorial	
Election; and		
WHEREAS, in the United States, less than 60% of eligible voters participated in the 2012		
Presidential Elec	tion; and	
WHEREAS, of the 119 nations that elect their public officials using democratic elections,		
the United States is one of only 11 nations that does not have the right to vote in its Constitution;		
and		
WHEREAS	S, the 15 <sup>th</sup> , 19 <sup>th</sup> , and 26 <sup>th</sup> Amendments to the U.S. Constitution provide that the	
right to vote shall	ight to vote shall not be denied or abridged based on race, sex, and age respectively, and the 24	
Amendment prohibits poll taxes. However, these amendments do not guarantee Americans an		
explicit right to v	vote.	
NOW, THE	EREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's	
County, Maryland, that the Council calls on Congress to propose an amendment to the U.S.		
Constitution that	would grant an individual right to vote to every American citizen of voting age;	
and		

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that that the County Council calls on Congress to restore Section 4 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 by creating a new coverage formula to determine which states and local jurisdictions should have voting changes reviewed for potential discriminatory impact; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council calls on Congress to give residents of Washington, D.C. full representation and voting rights in the House of Representatives and in the United States Senate; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council supports Maryland's recent expansion of early voting and the adoption of same-day voter registration.
