REPORT: COMMITTEE VOTE: Favorable 4-0 (Councilmember's: Campos, Turner, Davis, and Lehman)

This legislation will enable the Fire/EMS Department to continue its role in fire prevention and life safety enhancements by using the most up-to date code available. The increase in fees collected for fire and safety inspections will allow the Fire/EMS Department to maintain consistency with the State and other jurisdictions. The addition of the word "Novelty Lighter" to the definitions in Subtitle 11 Section 11-102 will assist the Fire/EMS Department in their primary focus of protecting those in our community who are most at risk.

The Office of Law has reviewed this bill and finds it to be in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to it enactment.

The enactment of CB-96-2012 will have a positive fiscal impact as a result of the proposed increase in current administrative fees. The estimated revenue to the county is approximately \$58,000.
