# **SECOND READING OF BILLS (INTRODUCTION)**

<u>CB-31-2004 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING MARYLAND-WASHINGTON</u>
<u>REGIONAL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES</u> for the purpose of providing procedures for statutory review of proposed zoning relating to annexations by a municipality with zoning authority. - <u>INTRODUCED</u>

Council Member Dernoga as Chairman of the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee provided a verbal report of the committee's actions and recommendations to the Council. Council Bill 31 provides an open and objective process for the consideration, by the District Council, of initial zoning determinations when property is annexed into a municipality that exercises zoning authority. At the present time, only the City of Laurel exercises zoning authority independent of the Regional District. Council Bill 31 was introduced by Council Members Dernoga, Exum, Dean, Peters and Shapiro.
