	Task Force for Service Consolidation and Cost Reductions
For the purpose	of establishing a Service Consolidation and Cost Reductions Task Force to
identify opportu	nities for the consolidation of services currently performed independently by
both the Board o	of Education and the Government of Prince George's County to provide cost
savings in both I	Board of Education and County budgets.
WHEREAS	S, the State of Maryland is facing a deficit and, for the first time, Governor
O'Malley has pr	oposed cutting education funding by 2%, which constitutes an additional loss for
Prince George's	County Public Schools; and
WHEREAS	S, State and local education funding is based on enrollment and the Prince
George's County	y Public Schools have experienced a significant decline in enrollment of 7,032
students over the	e past five years; is currently at a student population of approximately of
118,000; and	
WHEREAS	S, the Superintendent of Prince George's County Schools has proposed a budget
that reduces or c	ompletely eliminates many long-standing programs and services that are valued
by students and j	parents; and
WHEREAS, the citizens of Prince George's County have expressed a desire to increase	
both per pupil sp	pending and funding for the classroom; and
WHEREAS	S, Prince George's County Government continues to confront fiscal challenges
impacting service	es provided to County residents; and

WHEREAS, a consolidation plan may identify opportunities to merge services required by County government with the same or similar services required by the Board of Education to

reduce costs and eliminate duplication; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council previously sought a clearer understanding of the budgetary challenges and adopted CR-27-1996 to examine possible ways to economize in light of an economic downturn and the resultant County agency reductions, elimination of services and programs, and deferred capital improvements; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that due to the economic climate; a Service Consolidation and Cost Reductions Task Force is hereby created to examine and identify opportunities for consolidation of services to reduce costs to the Board of Education and Prince George's County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Council will maintain a long-term focus on local efficiency using existing county agencies that will support local initiatives, promote cost savings and follow through on the Task Force recommendations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Service Consolidation and Cost Reductions Task Force shall be comprised of seventeen members, who shall be appointed in the following manner:

- One member shall be appointed by the County Council Chair and serve as Chairman of the Task Force;
- 2. One member shall be appointed by the Prince George's County Board of Education Chair and shall serve as Vice Chair of the Task Force;
- 3. One member shall be appointed by the County Executive;
- 4. One member shall be appointed by the State of Maryland Board of Education;
- 5. One member shall be appointed by the Association of Supervisory and Administrative School Personnel;
- 6. One member shall be appointed by the Association of Classified Employees (ACE) or School Employees Local 400;
- 7. One member shall be appointed by the Prince George's County Chamber of Commerce;
- 8. One member shall be the Superintendent of Prince George's County Schools or his designee;
- 9. One member shall be appointed by the Office of Management and Budget;
- 10. One member shall be appointed by the Office of Finance;
