CR-11-2004 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS – POLICE OFFICIALS – SALARY SCHEDULE P-O SCHEDULE OF PAY GRADES for the purpose of amending the Salary Plan of the County to reflect certain wage and benefit modifications of Police Officials. - INTRODUCED

Council Resolution 11, as proposed by the Chairman by request of the County Executive, amend the Salary Plan in Salary Schedule P-O for 36 Police Officials (13 Majors, 23 Captains) above the rank of Lieutenant, covering FY2004 – FY2005 and will implement similar economic benefits and modifications contained in the Arbitration Award.
