The Health, Human Services, and Public Safety Committee met on February 20, 2025, to consider the appointment of Ms. Stephanye R. Maxwell, a resident of Laurel, to the Police Accountability Board.

The Police Accountability Board comprises eleven (11) Prince George's County residents appointed by the County Executive and County Council. The Police Accountability Board receives complaints of police misconduct involving the public and refers them to the appropriate law enforcement agency for investigation.

Ms. Miriam Brewer, Appointment Liaison, Office of the Acting County Executive, introduced Ms. Maxwell to the committee, highlighting her educational background, professional experience, and leadership roles in community organizations. Ms. Maxwell then provided an overview of her professional background and expressed her dedication to serving on the Police Accountability Board.

The committee members commended Ms. Maxwell for her career achievements, including her tenure with county government, and expressed their gratitude for her willingness to serve on the Police Accountability Board.

After discussion, the Health, Human Services, and Public Safety Committee voted favorably 4-0 on Ms. Maxwell's appointment to the Police Accountability Board.
